COVID-19: SUSPENSION OF ALL OVERSEAS PLACEMENTS AND ADDITIONAL PRECAUTIONARY MEASURES FOR TRAVELLERS

Dear Colleagues and Students

NUS STAFF AND STUDENT DISCHARGED FROM NCID LATEST

- I am pleased to share with you the news that the faculty member from the School of Design & Environment and the student from the Faculty of Engineering have both been discharged from the National Centre for Infectious Diseases (NCID). Both were part of a church cluster and had tested positive for COVID-19 in February 2020.
- 2. The professor and student are well, and are happy to be back with their families. Our colleagues will continue to be in regular contact with them to ensure that they have the support they need.

IMPORTANT UPDATES

- The World Health Organization declared the COVID-19 outbreak a <u>global pandemic</u> on 11 March 2020.
- 4. On 12 March 2020, Singapore's Prime Minister Lee Hsien Loong <u>addressed</u> the nation on the country's approach to the local COVID-19 situation, and said that the outbreak may last for a year or longer.
- 5. To prevent the further importation and spread of COVID-19 cases, the Ministry of Health announced new travel restrictions on <u>13 March 2020</u>, as well as <u>15 March 2020</u>.
- 6. The Ministry of Education together with the Institutes of Higher Learning have suspended all official overseas placements, including all internships and exchange programmes, until end-July 2020. Official overseas trips for staff will also be suspended until end-July 2020.
- 7. The Global Relations Office as well as Faculties and Schools will be in contact with the affected students to provide assistance.
- 8. The Ministry of Manpower has also issued <u>guidelines on social distancing measures at the workplace</u>.

All Outbound Travel

- 10. As the COVID-19 situation continues to evolve around the world, you are strongly advised to defer all official travel and non-essential travel during this period.
- 11. Staff and students who must travel for official reasons must seek the approval of their supervisors or the management office of their departments.
- 12. If you must travel, please stay alert to the latest COVID-19 news in the countries you are visiting. Singaporeans should also <u>e-register</u> their overseas travel with the Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
- 13. Please remember to declare your upcoming travel plans (for up to 31 July 2020) in the Overseas Travel Declaration system by 31 March 2020. You must also update your travel declaration if there are any subsequent changes to your travel plans.
- 14. Students who do not declare their travel plans will not be able to access LumiNUS.

Being Socially Responsible

- 15. While these additional precautionary measures may temporarily disrupt your work or study activities and travel plans, it is vital that we strictly abide by these measures.
- 16. Non-compliance with any of the control measures implemented by the Singapore authorities is subject to prosecution under the Infectious Diseases Act; and work passes, student passes and re-entry permits may be revoked or have their validity shortened.
- 17. Please also note that non-compliance with measures introduced by NUS to prevent the spread of the COVID-19 is considered an offence, and disciplinary action will be taken against staff and students. All non-compliance will be dealt with in accordance to the NUS Code of Conduct and the NUS student disciplinary procedures.
- 18. We must continue to be socially responsible to prevent the spread of COVID-19. We need to be vigilant, practise good personal hygiene, and take all necessary precautions for the health and wellbeing of our colleagues, students, friends and families.
