Participants	If all participants are from the institution (i.e. staff and/or enrolled students only), the event can proceed without VDS. However, if the event involves external participants (e.g. parents), the event is subject to VDS.
Event Size	Event sizes are based on the capacity of the venue. Events can take place with up to 1,000 persons or 75% of the capacity of the venue, whichever is higher ² .
TraceTogether-only SafeEntry (TTSE)	All participants must check in to the event venue via TTSE.
Mask off	<p>For indoor events, all participants are to keep their masks on during the event.</p> <p>For outdoor events, mask wearing is optional, subject to prevailing group size of 10 persons and safe-distancing of 1 metre between individuals or groups.</p> <p>Speakers can remove their mask when giving their speech, but should remain at least 1 metre away from participants when giving their speech.</p>
Singing	Singing of National Anthem and school songs are allowed, subject to masks being worn throughout the activity.
Photo taking	<p>For official photos (e.g. group photo of award winners taken by official photographers), there should be no more than 20 persons in the photo. Persons in the photo should be positioned at least 1-metre apart. They may only unmask during photo taking, and must promptly put their mask on in between and after the photo taking.</p> <p>Participants are allowed to take personal photographs. During these photographs, individuals should remain masked throughout. Institutions should put in place crowd management processes to prevent crowding and unnecessary intermingling due to photo taking.</p>

Participants should be assigned a fixed seat for food consumption, seated in groups of up to 10 persons, and should stick to this fixed seating as much as possible.
